Dino-mite Story Books

The Dinosaur Who Lived in My Backyard

by **B.G. Hennessy (Penguin Books USA, Inc.)**

A little boy tells about the dinosaur that (might have) lived in his back yard and the hundred pounds of vegetables it ate everyday.

Dinosaur Dinosaurs

by **Bryon Barton (HaperCollins, Inc. 1989)**

Dinosaurs

by **Grace Maccarone (Scholastic, 2001)**

Have simple and easy to understand text. Each book talks about differences among dinosaurs such as big, small, long, spiked, or horned. Either one makes an excellent introductory book to a dinosaur unit.

Dinosaur Dinners

by **Lee Davis (DK Publishing, Inc., 1998)**

Tells about meat- and plant-eating dinosaurs. It also describes how plant-eating dinosaurs protected themselves from the meat-eaters.
